Paperbacks begin at 50 cents and hardbacks at \$1. For easy shopping, books are categorized by dozens of volunteers, who work throughout the year organizing and pricing books. Also, the Friends sponsor satellite sales at library branches, offering used books in gift-giving condition all year long. - Durham Civil Rights Heritage Project: collected personal anecdotes and photographs from the Jim Crow and Civil Rights Movement eras in Durham, and created banners for a traveling display.
- Nintendo Wii and other gaming programs for teens: new equipment and games attract hundreds of teens to the library.
