#### **QUALIFICATIONS**

- ▼ Must be a registered voter in Durham County
- Must be able to read and write; of good repute
- Must attend mandatory training
- Must not be an elected government official or a manager or treasurer for any candidate or political party
- Must not be a candidate or immediate family member of candidate in the election

#### **APPOINTMENTS**

Durham County precinct officials can be recommended by the political parties and are appointed by the Durham County Board of Elections for a two-year term beginning in August of odd-numbered years.

#### **AVAILABLE POSITIONS**

The **CHIEF JUDGE** is the head precinct official and is in charge of Election Day activities, as well as picking up and returning election supplies.

The **JUDGE** works closely with the Chief Judge and is responsible for conducting the election in the Chief Judge's absence. Together, they must sign all official documents and serve on a panel to resolve any challenges.

The Chief Judge and two Judges may not leave the polling place on Election Day.

The **ASSISTANT** serves when needed and at the discretion and direction of the Chief Judge.
Assistants may work less than a full Election Day.

**ONE-STOP WORKERS** staff early voting sites throughout the County for over two weeks prior to Election Day. Both full-time and part-time positions are available. Data entry skills are helpful.

**TECHNICIANS** deliver and service election equipment. In addition to Election Day, they must be available the day before and the day after the election. The ability to lift 40 lbs, a NCDL, and a vehicle are required.

#### TRAINING

All election workers are required to attend training sessions conducted by the Durham County Board of Elections prior to each major primary and general election. Evening and weekend classes are available. Contact the Board of Elections office for details.

#### **COMPENSATION**

Election workers are compensated for training and election work. All wages are directly deposited.

#### **ELECTION DAY EXPECTATIONS**

- Wear comfortable clothing and dress in layers
- Leave your campaign buttons and political gear at home
- Arrange for food, drinks, and medication for the entire day
- ◆ Smoking is not permitted in the polling place
- Focus on the voters
